










QUEENSLAND ROAD SAFETY LAWS

How can you obey the road rules?

<p>This chart outlines the Safe-n-Sound Child Restraints that will help you obey the Queensland Road Safety Laws.</p> <p><i>It is recommended that your child stays in their child restraint as long as they fit before moving to the next restraint, regardless of their age.</i></p> <p><i>If your child is too big for the recommended restraint, they should use a restraint specified for the next age group up.</i></p>		If your child is...

The Queensland Road Safety Laws also require:

- Children under four years will not be allowed to travel in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows even if the child is three years of age and large enough to sit in a booster seat.
- Children aged between four and seven years will not be allowed to travel in the front seat of a vehicle with two or more rows, unless all other back seats are occupied by children under seven years of age.
- Taxis will continue to be exempt from the child restraint requirements. When there is no suitable child restraint available a seat belt must be worn.
- In vehicles with only one row of seats, a child can sit in the front provided they are properly restrained.
- If the vehicle has a passenger air bag fitted, a rearward facing child restraint must not be used.
- The Road Safety Laws aim to cater for the majority of children; however children vary in shapes and sizes. The ages outlined above are an approximation only. If your child still fits the restraint, they should remain in their current restraint regardless of their age. Alternatively if your child is too big for the recommended restraint, they should use a restraint specified for the next age group. Vehicles with only one row of seats are exempt from the requirement that a child must sit in the rear seat.

*This chart allows you to check that your child and their car seat will be suitable for the National and Queensland Road Safety Laws. Application of the Australian Road Safety Laws may vary by state or territory, but following this chart will maximise your child's safety.
