How can you obey the road rules?

<p>This chart outlines the Safe-n-Sound Child Restraints that will help you obey the South Australian Road Safety Laws.</p> <p><i>It is recommended that your child stays in their child restraint as long as they fit before moving to the next restraint, regardless of their age.</i></p> <p><i>If your child is too big for the recommended restraint, they should use a restraint specified for the next age group up.</i></p>		If your child is...

The South Australian Road Safety Laws also require:

- Taxi drivers are not required to provide child restraints or booster seats. Taxi drivers must ensure children over one year old are seated with a properly fastened seatbelt if no child restraint is available. Children under one year do not have to use a restraint, but they must travel in the back seat. Children over one and under seven years old should be seated in their own seating position in a taxi, with their own properly fastened seatbelt if no suitable child restraint or booster seat is available.
- The Road Safety Laws aim to cater for the majority of children; however children vary in shapes and sizes. The ages outlined above are an approximation only. If your child still fits the restraint, they should remain in their current restraint regardless of their age. Alternatively if your child is too big for the recommended restraint, they should use a restraint specified for the next age group.

*This chart allows you to check that your child and their car seat will be suitable for the National and South Australian Road Safety Laws.

Application of the Australian Road Safety Laws may vary by state or territory, but following this chart will maximise your child's safety.
